The Sangiacomo family has employed many sustainable methods of farming ever since they began cultivating the ranch in 1927. Over the decades they have gradually increased these practices. In 2015 they attained 100% sustainable certification for all of their vineyards granted by the California Sustainable Winegrowing Alliance (CSWA). Their efforts are in alignment with Sonoma County's commitment to become the first wine region in the U.S. that is 100% sustainable by 2019.

Their sustainable approach enables the family to meet the needs of today and help ensure future generations will meet their own needs. As a third-generation family business, the Sangiacomos consider how decisions made today will impact the environment, their children, grandchildren, the industry, and the community at large.

As sustainable farmers the Sangiacomos commit to being environmentally conscientious with farming practices; economically viable as a business; and socially responsible in how they treat employees, neighbors, clients, and community. The result is clear: the land is preserved in agriculture with low environmental impact; employees are trained, safe and treated with respect; clients share in win/win relationships; and the business endures.
